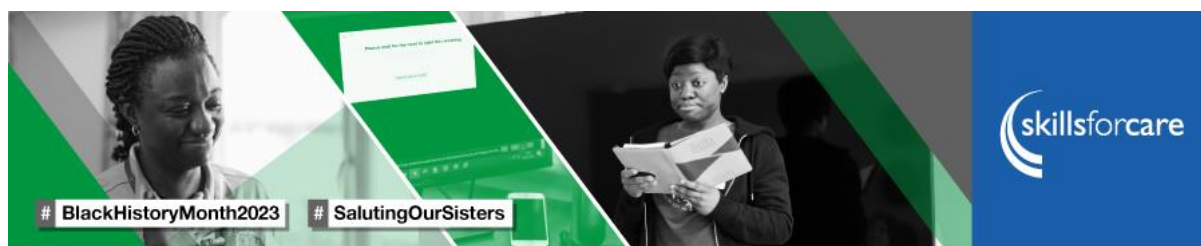




South London Partnership Social Care Academy Hub Health and Social Care opportunities, courses and employment support
